## Our Prayer of the Week

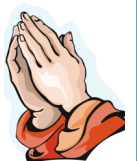
*A prayer for our school community...*

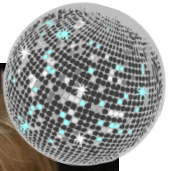
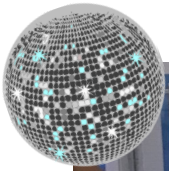


## Don't let a little worry turn into a big one...
