Go, shine in the world

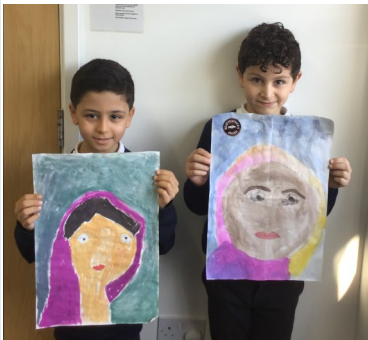


Dear Parents and Carers,

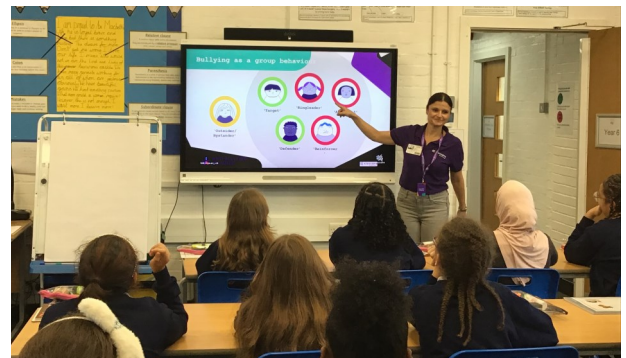
Anti-bullying

This week is anti-bullying week. To highlight the importance of anti-bullying, all children took part in an assembly to recap the key messages around bullying such as what to do if you or somebody else is being bullied.



Year 5 & 6 also took part in a **Bullying Awareness Champions** workshop put on by **Kidscape**. This was an interactive workshop where they were involved in a range of activities involving role play and discussions on how to respond to bullying situations.

The messages on bullying is not something that is only taught during anti-bullying week, but is regularly recapped throughout the year. It was fantastic to see how much knowledge the children had on this topic. Please talk to your child about what they have learnt and get them to share the key messages with you on anti-bullying.
