Dear Parents and Carers,

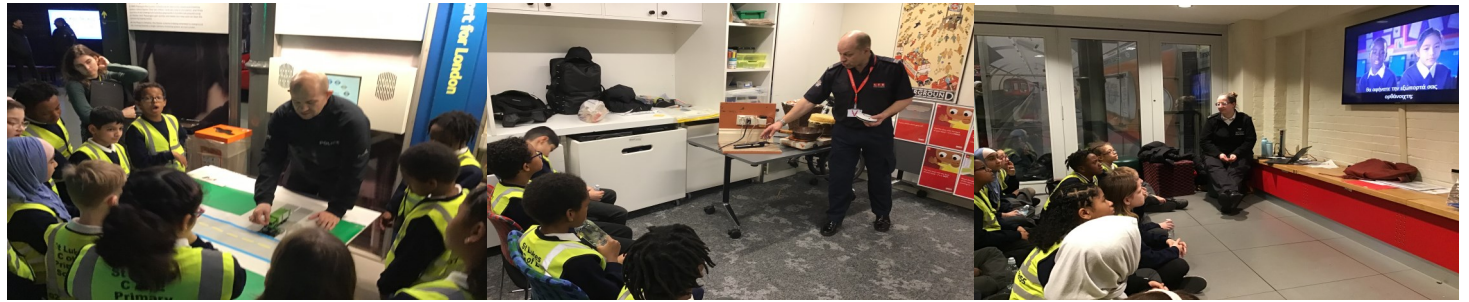

PSHCE in Y6: Visit to the London Transport Museum

This week, Year 6 attended a workshop organised by Transport for London, helping them to prepare for the challenges they may face as young adults. In workshops run by TFL, the Metropolitan Police, London Fire Brigade and St John's Ambulance, Year 6 learned about travelling safely and responsibly using bus or tube. The sessions taught the children about getting help, what to do in an emergency, awareness of possible dangers, personal safety, showing respect for members of staff and journey planning.
