Dear Parents and Carers,

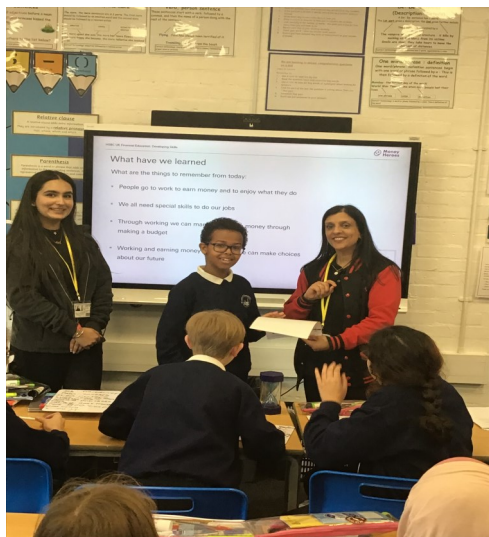
We were pleased to let you know on Monday that the Governing Bodies of the five partnership schools, including St Luke's, have approved the formation of the Go Shine CE Federation. Thank you to each of you who replied to the consultation; Governors were provided with every response to consider before they made their decision and were grateful for the support shown by all sections of our community.

The federation is due to be formed on 2nd June 2025, immediately after the May half-term. As explained in the consultation, there will be no change in the day-to-day practices of the school: the school name, school logo, school uniform, staffing and the timings of the school day will all stay the same. Everything will remain familiar to pupils and parents.
