Dear Parents and Carers,

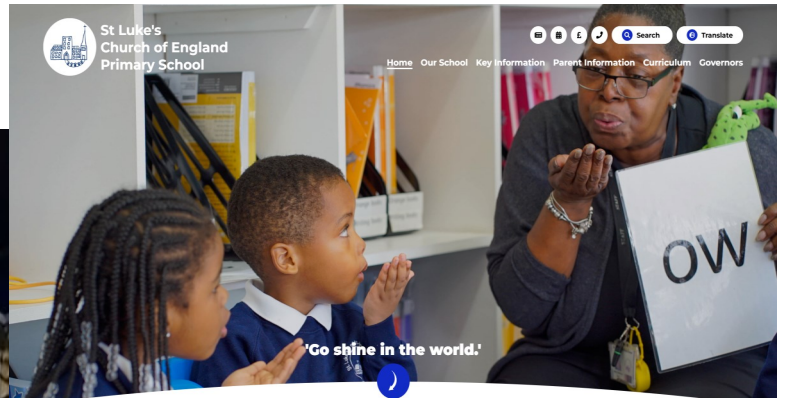

There are helpful sections on the home page to quickly find what you need. Want to check the term dates? Here they are! Wondering what is on the lunch menu? Take a look!

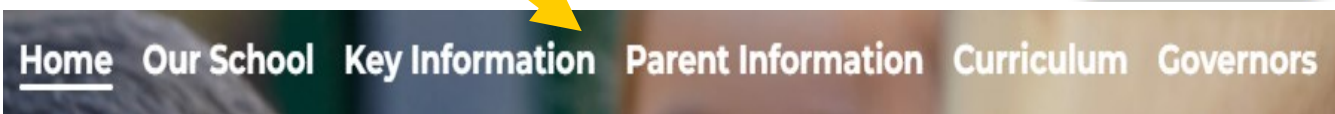
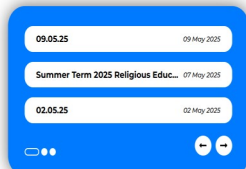
