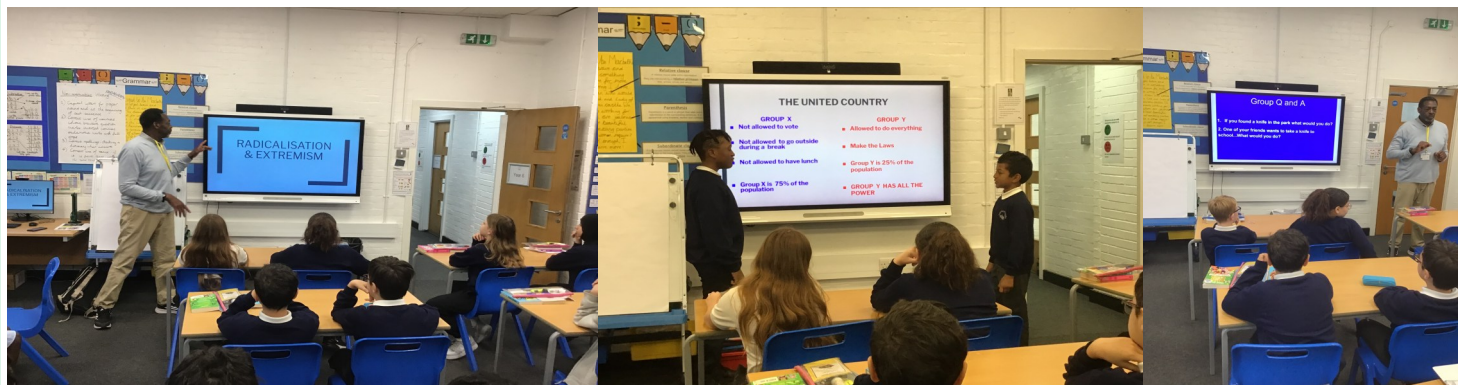
## RE in KS2: Wintershall assembly
