Please make sure your child is in school every single day unless they are too unwell to come to school.

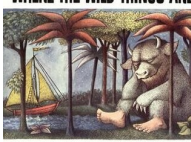
A reminder that gates open at **8.40am** and children should be in school by **8.50am** ready to start their learning.
