A reminder that gates open at **8.40am** and children should be in school by **8.50am** ready to start their learning.



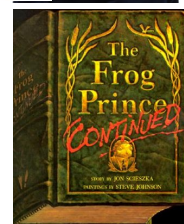
Work of the Week!
