This week's brilliant piece of work displayed in the school lobby is by **Naomi in Year 4.**

Year 4's topic in Science this term is 'Animals Including Humans'. The children have been learning about how sugar can damage teeth and they carried out an investigation looking at how different types of liquid containing varying amounts of sugar can damage enamel.



Naomi's investigation includes an enquiry question, method, diagram, prediction, results and conclusion. She has used scientific terminology throughout and produced a clear explanation of her findings.
