We know that it is you who give us the breath of life.



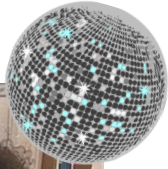
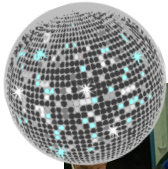

## Messy Thursday Ground Rules
