Do be honest.	<i>Don't tell lies or cover up the truth.</i>
Do understand its OK to make mistakes.	<i>Don't laugh at those who are brave enough to have a go.</i>
Do work hard and try your best.	<i>Don't waste time or give up easily.</i>

A reminder that gates open at **8.40am** and children should be in school by **8.55am** ready to start their learning.



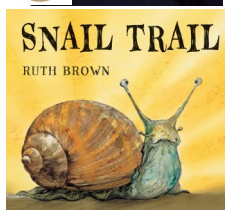
Work of the Week!
