## Work of the Week!

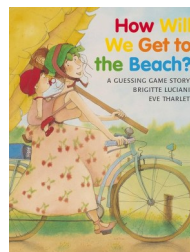
This week's brilliant piece of work displayed in the school lobby is by Amayah in Reception.

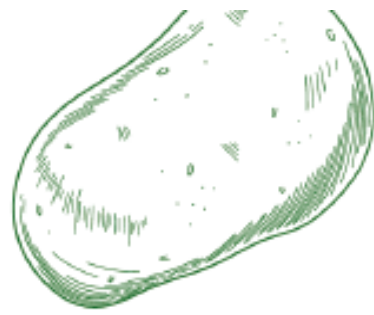


## Don't let a little worry turn into a big one...
