Work of the Week!

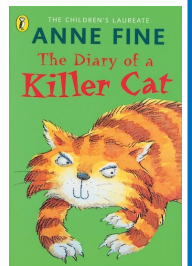
This week's brilliant piece of work displayed in the school lobby is by **James in Year 3**.

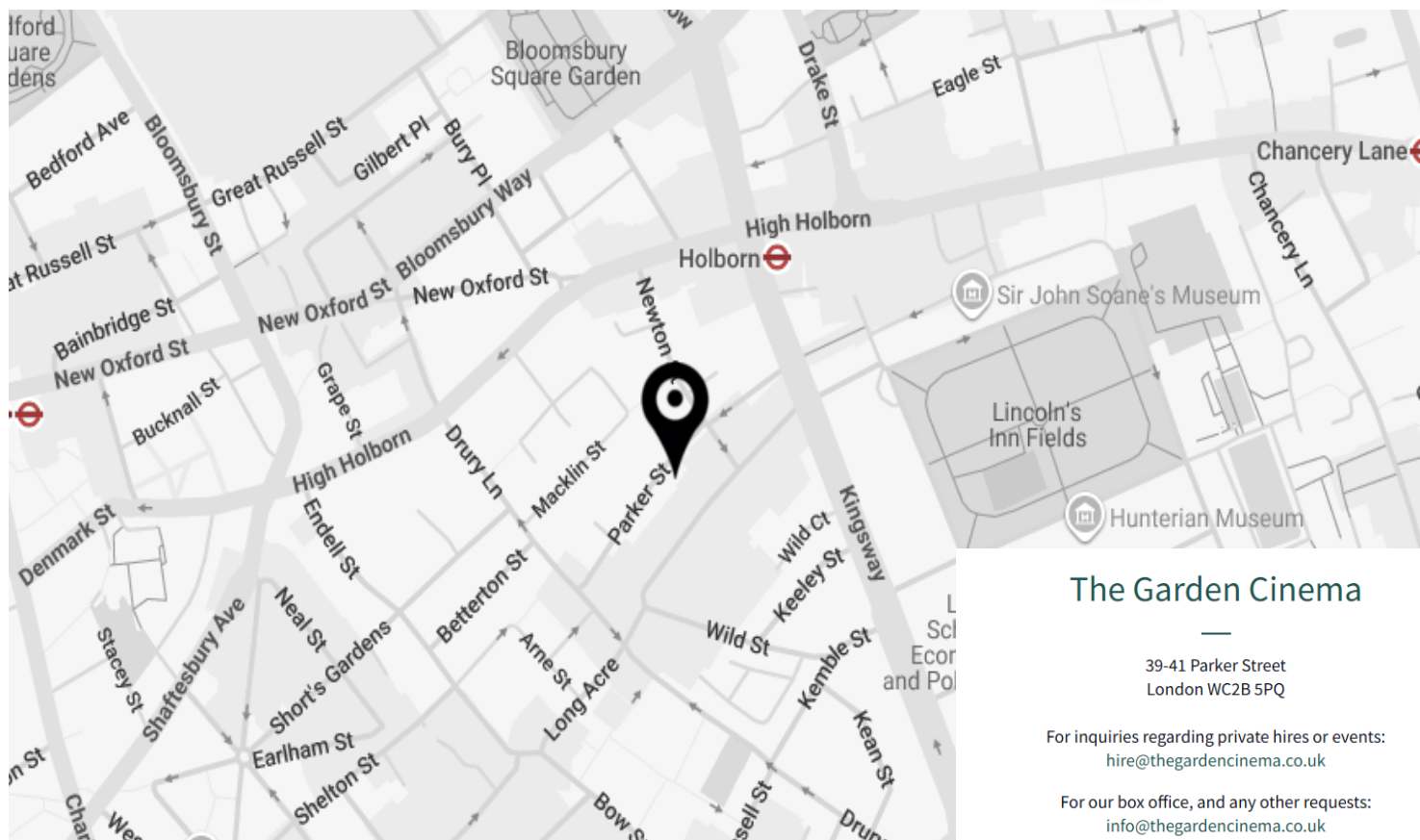
