During this term at St James and St John, pupils will be learning about Christianity in Religious Education lessons. The children will also take the time to write prayers in their individual prayer books on throughout the term linked to spirituality.

1st Half Term

Reception – Christianity - Who made the wonderful world and why?

Year 1 - Christianity - Why should we take care of the world?

Year 2 - Christianity - What are some of the important events in a Christian's life?

Year 3 - Christianity - What is the Bible's 'Big Story'?

Year 4 - Christianity - How did belief in God affect the actions of people from the Old Testament?

Year 5 - Christianity - How does prayer and pilgrimage draw Christians closer to God?

Year 6 - Christianity - What might the journey of life and death look like from a Christian perspective?

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

Help your child to find out about the area of religion they are studying in class by using books from the library and websites.

2nd Half Term

Reception - Christianity - Why is Christmas special for Christians?

Year 1 - Christianity - Why is each person important in the Nativity story?

Year 2 - Christianity - How does the symbol of light help us to understand the meaning of Christmas for Christians?

Year 3 - Christianity - Who is Jesus? (I am statements)

Year 4 - Christianity - What kind of peace do Christians believe Jesus brings, and does it matter today?

Year 5 - Christianity - How do art and music convey Christmas?

Year 6 - Christianity - Can science and religion work together?

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

Ask your children to tell you the story of Christmas and what God's ultimate gift to mankind is. Find out about some Christian symbols for Advent e.g., Advent wreath, candles, calendar.

ALL SAINTS

(1st November)

We celebrate the lives of special and ordinary people who have responded to God's invitation to love.

THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (ALL SOULS)

(2nd November)

ADVENT

(Begins 29th November)

Advent means 'coming'. We think of the coming of Jesus - when he was born - but we also think of his promise that he would come again at the end of time. It is a time of waiting and preparing. It is only in the last week of Advent that we focus upon the events to be celebrated at Christmas.

CHRISTMAS DAY, THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

(25th December)

On this day we begin our celebration of the birth of Christ.
